To my grand daughter Susie E. Cesten, two quilts one of the quilts to be my wheel of fortune quilt, one pair sheets, one wash bowl and pitcher and the sum of twenty-five dollars.

To my grand daughter Gertie Cesten, one pair of sheets and the sum of twenty-five dollars.

To my grand daughter, Ethel V. Mizell one feather bed, one mattress, two pillows, one

bolster, two quilts, one pair sheets and the sum of twenty-five dollars.

To my daughter Mrs. Channell one pair sheets, one quilt, one set of silver knives, and forks and the sum of twenty-five dollars.

To my daughter Mrs Ed. Cesten the sum of five dollars.

To Cypress Chapel Christian church the sum of five dollars.

I request that my two sons W.J.Mizell and C.M.Mizell shall paint the fence that encloses the grave yard on the Wm. Frost farm near Nursey'sville.

After all my just debts and funeral expenses have been paid I give and bequest all the rest and remainder of my property to my two sons W.J.Mizell and C.M.Mizell to be equally divided between them.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my sons W.J.Mizell and C.M.Mizell to be the executors of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I the said Emiline Mizell have to this my last will and testament consisting of one sheet of paper subscribed my name this 21st day of January 1908.
