I, W.S. WESTON of Deep Creek in the County of Norfolk in the State of Virginia, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, and as to my world estate and all the property real and personal of which I shall die seized or possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, I devise, bequeath, and dispose thereof in the manner following to-wit:

MY WILL is that all my just debts and Funeral expenses shall by my Executors herein-after named be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease, as shall by them be found convenient:

I GIVE devise and bequeath to my Nephew H.W. Gary all of my estate both real and personal whatsoever,

AND LASTLY I do nominate and appoint George Culpepper my executor of this my last will and testament.
