

In the name of God. Amen. I Augustine Delaware Hewitt of the County of
New Kent, in the State of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory
do make, declare and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking
any will, or writing in the nature thereof, heretofore made, or published purporting
to have been made by me, that I desire that all of my just debts shall be
fully paid as soon after my death as practicable by my Executors hereinafter named
out of my personal estate which I believe to be ample for that purpose. 2 Item:
I devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Maggie A. Hewitt all of my
real and personal estate of whatsoever kind, whether in possession, remainder,
or reversion, to have, use, and enjoy fully and absolutely, during her natural
life, giving to her my said wife full power and authority to sell any portion
of my personal estate as may be necessary for her comfortable support, she
to be the sole judge of the necessity of making such sale.
3 Item: After the death of my said wife, I devise and bequeath all of my real
estate, and such of my personal estate as may then remain, to my daughter
Susan Josephine Hewitt, and my grandson Ruly Morris, in equal portions.
Should and should abide and should either my said daughter or my said
grandson die having no child or children surviving her or him, then in such
case I do devise and bequeath the share of my said daughter or grandson
who may die as aforesaid, to the survivor of either of them. And if at the
time of the death of my said wife, either or both, my said daughter or
grandson shall be under the age of Twenty One years, it is my will and
desire, and I do so devise and bequeath, that the share or shares of such

Minor child or children shall be held by D.C. Richardson of the County of Richmond in trust for the sole use and benefit of such child or children until she or he shall attain to the full age of twenty one years.

4 Item: Should any said daughter and grand son live die without leaving any child or children surviving them or either of them, I do devise and bequeath the whole of my estate, both real and personal which may then remain, to D.C. Richardson and Percy Hewitt Richardson, in equal proportions, theirs and theirs heirs, if then alive, or to the survivor of either of them should one be dead; and should they or either of them be minors at that time, it is my will and desire that the share or shares of such minor child or children shall be held by D.C. Richardson in trust for their use and benefit during such minority.

Lastly: It is my will and desire that no intestate and appropriation of my Estate shall be made: and I do hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Maggie A. Hewitt to be the sole Executrix of this my last will and testament and request that the Court will not require security of her as such.
