I give to my two sons George and Jacob B. Subbar one hundred and fifty dollars each, to be paid by my Executor herein after named, whenever it may be Entirely convenient for he to do it, without interest thereon.

The residue of my Estate (both real and personal) I give to my wife Pamela during her widowhood for the joint support of herself and children; and at her death or marriage, I direct that it may be Equally divided amongst her children; I have any of my said wife's children marry before her death or marriage, they shall not have any part, of the profits of my Estate, until her death.

And lastly, I nominate and appoint my said wife Pamela Executor to the my last will and Testament, and does requiring her to give Security for the same.
