

I, Caroline Nelson Pollard, being of sound mind, do hereby make this my last will and testament. I appoint my son James Pollard and my son-in-law Thomas E Ballard my executors, without security. I desire that so much of my farm, known as Roxbury, lying on the Chickahominy River in the County of New Kent, be sold, as will pay, all of my just debts - or the whole of said farm may be sold if the legates prefer it. After my debts are payed I give and bequeathe to my two sons James Pollard and Thos Atkinson Pollard all the land that I am then possessed of, including plantation utensils, cattle, hogs and sheep - I desire my carriage to be sold for the benefit of my creditors - My chamber furniture I give to my son James Pollard, except the carpet and rug, which I give to my beloved daughter Ella Carter Ballard. The rest of my furniture I give to my son Thos A. Pollard except one Brussels carpet, which I give to my son James Pollard
