Jones of the County of New Kent, State of Va. of sound and disposing mind and memory do this day make this as my last will and testament as follows: That is to say, 1st I desire all of my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon after my disease as can conveniently be done by my Exeutor who is my wife 2nd I then desire that my wife shall whole possession of every species of property that shall be in my possession or due me at the time of my disease both personal and real to whole for her own proper use and benefit as long as she lives. after her death I desire that all of my property that shall have been in my possession or due me at the time of my disease both real and personal, except one half acre of land which I reserve as a burying ground with and outlet to the main road to be kept as my estate for ever to be equally divided between my four children to wit; Melbourn D. Jones, Mary A. Chapman and Octavia H. Jones and Pamela S. Drake or the lawful heirs of their bodies. I now nominate and appoint my wife Adelia A. Jones as Exeutor of this my last will and testament and for the performance of which duties I desire that she shall not give any security.
