Know all men by these presents that I, David Williams, of the County of New Kent, in the State of Virginia, have made published and declared and do make publish and declare this instrument of writing as and for my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

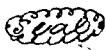
1st. I give and devise to John R. Williams, and his heirs, a certain piece or parcel of land bounded as follows, viz: on the North, Northeast, and Northwest by the lands of John Williams (the father of the said John R. Williams) and of John Timbulake, on the east by the road running from the residence of the said John Williams to my mill road, on the South by the said mill road, the

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piece or parcel of land hereby devised to the said John R. Williams being commonly called and known as "Bridens" and parcel of the tract of land on which I reside, and embracing that portion of the tract of land last mentioned contained within the two roads aforesaid and the boundary line which separates the same from the lands of the said John Williams and the said John Timberlake.

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2. I also give and devise to the said John R. Williams, and his heirs the undivided one half of my mill and the rights, privileges and appurtenances unto the same belonging.
3. I also give and bequeath to the said John R. Williams my slaves William, son, and William Jun.; the latter being a son of the former.
4. I give, devise and bequeath unto James N. Goddin of the said County of New Kent and his heirs, executors and administrators all the rest and residue of my estate real and personal, and of every kind and description.
5. and lastly I hereby constitute and appoint the James N. Goddin sole executor of this my last will and Testament, and direct that he shall not give security. In testimony whereof I the said David Williams have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Twenty first day of October A.D. Eighteen hundred and fifty two.
