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I Harriett Savage do hereby make ordain and declare
this to be my last will and Testament. now revoking
and annulling all former wills and Testaments
Item 1st I give, devise and bequeath unto my daughter
Mary A. S. Harbison a negro man named Marshall,
also a man named Lyttleton (Bew.) and two women nam-
ed Adelaide and Lucy Ann and Thom a child of Lucy
Ann, and the future increase of the said females as the
separate property of the said Mary A. S. Harbison and for
her sole and separate use and free from the debts and
liabilities of her husband Geo. Harbison. And the said
Mary A. S. Harbison shall have power to dispose of the
aforesaid property of her death by will, or otherwise in
her lifetime, but if she shall make no disposition
thereof at her death by will or otherwise in her lifetime
the aforesaid property at the death of the said Mary
A. S. shall be equally divided among her children then
living. Item 2nd I give my grand daughter Harriett B.
Stanke a negro woman named Betsey and two boys named
Jedrick and Thom and the future increase of the said
woman Betsey as the separate property of the said
Harriett B. and for her sole and separate use and

free from the debts and liabilities of her husband Mac-
 cles J. Clarke, and the said Harriett B. shall have power
 to dispose of the aforesaid property at her death by will
 or otherwise in her lifetime, but if she shall make no
 disposition thereof by will, at her death, or otherwise in
 her lifetime, the aforesaid property at the death of the
 said Harriett B. shall be equally divided among her chil-
 dren then living. In addition to the foregoing property and
 upon the same terms, I give the said Harriett B. one
 dozen tea spoons and one bed and bedding. Item 3rd I
 give to my grand-daughter Alice Brown Harkins a negro
 girl named Elizabeth (child of Adelaide) and her future
 increase. I also give and bequeath unto her three hun-
 dred dollars in money and my silver castors. Item 4th
 I give and bequeath unto my grand-daughter Har-
 riett Ann Harkins a negro girl named Louisa (child
 of Adelaide) and her future increase. I also give and
 bequeath her three hundred dollars in money and my
 silver ladle, silver salt stands and large spoons. Item
 5th I give and bequeath unto my grand-son Southey L. Har-
 kins a negro boy named Archer (child of Adelaide). Item
 6th I give and bequeath unto my grand-son George A. Harkins
 a negro boy named John (child of Adelaide). Item 7th I
 give and bequeath unto my grand-son Reynolds Harkins
 a negro boy named Nick (child of Adelaide). Item 8th

give and bequeath unto my Grandson Reynolds Hawkins
a negro boy named Hick (child of Adelaide) Item 8th
I give and bequeath unto my Grandson William Hawkins
a negro boy named George (child of Adelaide) Item 9th I
give and bequeath unto my daughter-in-law Ann. S. Sav-
age one hundred and fifty dollars with which I wish
her to purchase some memento of her regard for me. Item
10th I give to my grand-daughter Emily A. Crump Three hun-
dred dollars with which I wish her to purchase some
piece of plate. Item 11th I give and bequeath unto George
M. Savage my man Elam in Trust nevertheless to be hired
out by him annually and the proceeds of his hire to be
annually paid over to my grand-son Wm. H. Savage for
and during the full term of his natural life. Item
12th I give and bequeath unto Leonard L. Crump my negro
boy Lyttleton (Junior) in Trust nevertheless to be hired out
by him annually and the proceeds of his hire annually
paid over to my grand-son Southery L. Savage for and
during his natural life. And if at the death of the said
Southery L. his child Nathaniel L. should be living, I then
give the said negro boy Lyttleton to the said Nathaniel
Savage. But if the said child Nathaniel Savage should
not be living at the death of his father, I then give the
said negro boy Lyttleton to my grand-daughters Mary S.
Savage and Maria S. Savage. Item: 13th I give and be-
queath unto my grand-son Norton Reynolds Savage a

negro man named Thom. Item 14th I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Sally E. Savage a negro girl named (Ella) (child of Bitsey) and her future increase. I also give and bequeath unto her three hundred dollars in money. Item 15th I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary L. Savage one Thousand dollars. Item 16th I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Maria Parker Savage one Thousand dollars. Item 17th I give and bequeath unto George M. Savage my negro boy named Frank, in trust nevertheless to be hired out annually by him until my grand daughter Maria P. Savage arrives at the age of eighteen years. During that period of time the annual hires of the said negro Frank shall be equally divided by the said trustee between my three grand daughters viz: Sally E. Mary L. and Maria P. Savage and when the said Maria P. arrives to the age of eighteen years, I then give the said negro boy Frank to my two grand daughters Mary L. and Maria P. Savage. But if the said Maria P. should die before she reaches the age of eighteen then the said Mary L. shall be entitled in fee to the said negro boy, or if the said Mary L. shall die before the said Maria P. reaches the age of eighteen then the said Maria shall be entitled in fee to the said boy (Frank). Item 18th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary A. S. Hankins twenty dollars for the benefit of

Frank). Item 18th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary A. S. Hankins twenty dollars for the benefit of my old servant Caroline and direct it to be given her in such sums as my said daughter may think fit and proper. Item 19th All the rest and residue of my property of every kind not herein disposed of by previous bequests. I give bequeath and devise unto my daughter Mary A. S. Hankins as and for her own separate property and for her own separate use and benefit free from all the debts and liabilities whatever of her husband George Hankins. I include in this the residuary clause of my will the boy Elam herein before bequeathed in trust to George M. Savage for the benefit of Wm. Savage during his lifetime meaning and desiring that at the death of the said Wm. Savage my said daughter Mary A. S. shall be entitled to the boy Elam upon the same terms as are mentioned in this item with respect to other property. Item 20th The estate of my deceased husband having many years ago been settled up and distributed and whilst I do not apprehend that any litigation will at my death arise in respect thereto yet to guard against any such result through the agency of any person entitled under this my will. Yet I hereby declare and provide that any legatee of property bequeathed him or her by this my last will, who shall

institute or cause to be instituted or have any concern
 or agency in the institution of any suit the object or ef-
 fect of which may be to disturb the settlement of my
 deceased husband's estate and to subject my estate to any
 responsibility for or on account of any claims against my
 said deceased husband's estate, or for or on account of any
 act done by me in respect to my said dower property. Such
 legatee under this my will shall not be entitled to any
 bequest herein made in his or her favor, and said beque-
 st shall be at once void and of no effect and shall
 be equally distributed among those not so offending.

Item 20th Lastly I hereby make constitute and appoint my
 son in law George Hankins, my relative George M. Savage
 and my friend Mrs. D. Christian executors of this my last
 will and testament and desire that no security be
 required of them or either of them. In Testimony whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal on
 this 16th day of July 1858.

Pursuant to an order of the County Court of New Kent County entered on the - day of June 1871. we the undersigned Three of the Commissioners therein named did on the 3rd day of July 1871 proceed to assign to Martha M. Woodward widow of Wyatt S. Woodward her dower in the lands belonging to the estate of her deceased husband. to wit: Beginning at an Ash on Mariner Swamp and the line dividing said land from the land of Andrew S. Richardson, thence East to White Oak, thence to Hickory, thence to Hickory, thence to Black Gum, thence to Red Oak, thence to White Oak, thence to White at junction of Yankee Road and Road to Barkhamsville, thence North East to White Oak on said Road to Barkhamsville, thence to River, thence to White Oak, thence to White Oak near Ice pond, thence to river at the fence, thence East to White Oak, thence to corner sweet Gum on the edge of open land and embracing Grave yard in land, thence North West, designated by stops to dead walling, thence to sweet Gum at Branch, thence to corner White Oak on line of land belonging to Philemon L. Jones Estate
