I, James L. McCrump of the County of Nicholas, and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament

1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Maria L. McCrump, all of the property, both real and personal, I owned from the date of her death the late James McCrump of King William County Virginia at the death of her mother, and in addition thereto, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, the price and of my personal property, by my Executors hereinafter named, and condition that she receive the sum in view of her claims right in and to my Estate, she to have the right to dispose of the said bequest by will or in any manner, that she may choose.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my son William C. McCrump, that portion of my farm on which he now resides, commencing at the mouth of Mill Creek, upon the top of the pine south of Pasture Branch to a Cedar Stake, at the intersection of the road leading to my house and the hog row leading to the old Orchard to a Walnut stump, thence to an old ditch leading in a Southwesterly direction to Swamp, thence and Swamp and low grounds, to high land, thence diagonally

of two grants to the line dividing my farm from Mary
Mary Limerick to John Robertson line, thence along said line
to brook. Robertson's line to edge of woods, thence to
the beginning.

3^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Christian D.
Kannak I. and Maria J. Parsonson one eighth portion of my
farm bounded and described as follows, On the north by the
road leading from Cedar tree to Allen run. On the East by the
land of A. T. Parsonson. On the South by a chopped line running
from the line dividing my land from A. T. Parsonson, along
the line of chopped trees across two grants passing near a -
chopped Sawdust along stakes in the ground to a Plum bush
near my Young Orchard, thence down the road leading leading
to my son William's house to a Stake, at the corner of the fence
across my field, thence along the fence to a Holly tree, near the road
thence along the road to beginning.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Aforaid the tract
of land called Annan's on which George Allen now resides.

4th I give and bequeath to my sons Joseph M. and James T. Parson
son all the balance of my lands, not already disposed of.

5th I give and bequeath unto my daughter before mentioned all of
my house hold and kitchen furniture farming utensils and Stock
of provisions. I will and direct that all of my personal property
except am honored and Jesty slaves, bequeathed my wife and
the house hold and kitchen furniture, farming utensils and

Effects are removed and fifty dollars, bequeathed my wife and the house hold and kitchen furniture, farming utensils and stores of provisions bequeathed my daughters, be equally divided among all my children.

I hereby appoint my sons Joseph M. Williams C. and James T. Parkinson my Executors. In witness whereof I have in the presence of the subscribing witnesses signed sealed and published this as my last will and testament.
