

I Mary Ann Kelliards of the County of New Kent do make and ordain this as well for my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

I direct all my just debts be faithfully paid and for that purpose I subject my whole estate. I further direct that the whole of my estate after the payment of my debts and specific legacies herein after mentioned, be by my executors divided into five equal parts & distributed as follows. To my daughter Mary Ann D. Ralcliffe wife of William Ralcliffe I lend the one fifth part of my estate during her life and at her death I give the same to the children of the said Mary Ann D. Ralcliffe and theirs heirs forever.

To my daughter Lucy Jones wife of Rosland Jones I lend the one fifth part of my estate during her life and at her death I give the same to the child or children of the said Lucy Jones to them and theirs heirs forever.

To my daughter Martha Ann Littlepage wife of Edmund Littlepage. I lend one fifth part of my estate as also the interest on the estate of my deceased husband Benjamin Kelliard which interest I purchased of Lewis Littlepage who purchased the same of Edmund Littlepage (See deeds of record in New Kent office) during the life of the said Martha Ann. and at her death I give all the property here lent my said daughter to the child or children of the said Martha Ann to them and theirs heirs forever. The property hereby lent my said daughter Martha Ann Littlepage to be and remain under the control and superintendence of my executor herein after named, who will exercise such a discretionary power over the same as will secure to my said daughter and her family the uninterrupted enjoyment of the profits thereon and after her death her children.

To my grand daughter Mary Ann Woodward wife of William Woodward I lend the one fifth part of my estate as also the one half of the tract of land I own called Gates during her life and at her death I give the same to the child or children of the said

during her life and at her death I give the same to the child, or children of the said Mary Ann E. Woodward to them and their heirs forever.

To my grand son Lemuel Palatiffe son of my deceased daughter Susan B. Palatiffe I give one fifth part of my estate as also one half of the tract of lands I own called Bates should my said grand son die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years unmarried & without issue in that event the whole of the property hereby devised to him shall ~~to~~ ^{and} be divided amongst all my grand children, whereas my daughter Mary I. Palatiffe died leaving a child namely Mary Ann E. who he is unmarried with William Woodward, and my daughter Susan B. Palatiffe died leaving a child named Lemuel Palatiffe (an infant) and it being doubtful whether the children of my said deceased daughters Mary I. Palatiffe and Susan B. Palatiffe will after my death be entitled to any of the estate of their grand father the late Benjamin Halliwell died and which is now held by me during my life they my said daughters having died before me for greater certainty and abundant caution I hereby direct and will that in case any party interested in my estate or the estate of my deceased husband should attempt, or attempting should succeed in preventing the said Mary Ann E. Woodward and Lemuel Palatiffe or either of them or either of their heirs ~~or~~ from obtaining the part or parts of the estate of my said deceased husbands that would have descended to them if they were alive at the time of my death, that then and in that case I do hereby will that so much be deducted from the parts or portions of my estate hereby willed to my three daughters Mary Ann Palatiffe, Lucy Jones and Martha Ann Littlepage as will make the said Mary Ann E. Woodward and Lemuel Palatiffe equal with the children of the said Mary Ann Palatiffe, Lucy Jones and Martha Ann Littlepage as of the life estate should be at my death (the matters of the children being dead) divided per capita amongst all my grand children, such portion however not to exceed one sixth each and so in proportion for a greater or

last number of grand children. Lastly, I constitute and appoint my son in law
William Polittie Executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof
