 her to do as she may wish with discretion to be paid to
 her, Robert is to be paid to him, they are not to have any
 Guardian or trustee but to hold it and as I leave them
 to do as they think proper with. I give Georgia Black and
 white Cow and calf. Wilson has two cows, Section the rest

the others I give to Ina and Robert the Sheep to Robert
