I, Pleasant Tompson do hereby make the following alterations in the within will. In the event of my wife Philip Tompson managing my will, is that she shall only have one third of my estate her life and she shall also give security in qualifying as my executrix. My will is that at the death of my wife Philip Tompson, my youngest son then living shall have my dwelling house and all the buildings adjacent thereto, with twenty acres of land attached thereto.
