

New Kent County Wills, Vol. I,
1864-1887
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In the name of God, amen; I, Robert Drake, of the County of New Kent, State of Virginia, of sound and disposing mind, do this day make this as my last will and testament as follows, that is to say, I desire, all of my just debts, and funeral expenses be paid by my executors as soon after my disease as possible. I then desire that all of my perishable estate be paid as soon after my disease as convenient I am by my executor, and the amount arising from said pays together with other small amounts and intrest, which is due from intrest funds collected, and put together, and not the principal of any debts of any note shall be collected as yet. Out of said amount I desire my executors to receive 5 per cent com. and then pay to my son William M. Drake out of said amount one thousand dollars as his full portion of my perishable estate. Then pay to Martha T. Raach or the lawful heirs of her body one thousand dollars as her full portion of my perishable estate.

The balance then remaining of paid pays, and other amounts which have been collected, to be put at intrest, together with all other amounts, which shall be on hand or due otherwise. and the intrest arising from all dues to be collected yearly for 3 consecutive years, and pay to Mrs Martha Hicks, wife of John Hicks, Twenty dollars at the expiration of each year for the 3 years, if she lives as long.

Twenty dollars to be paid to Mrs Nancy Cumber, wife of Soden M. Cumber, of paid intrest fund, at the expiration of each year for the 3 years if she lives as long.

The remaining intrest arising from said funds to be collected annually for each of the 3 years, and pay one half of said amount to Mrs Mary Wall, wife of Robert Walls, or her heirs each year and the other half to be payed to my executors Vernon P. Jones or his assigns.

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At the expiration of 3 years my real estate to be sold by my executors and net of the expenses of said real estate my executors to receive two and a half per

The woman, Sarah, which I got of William M. Drake I give back to him
The remaining portion of money from said sale, together with all other dues,
in bonds, notes, or any other way that shall be in my possession or due me
at the time of my disease, shall be divided into four equal parts; the one
part I give to Mrs. Mary Walls, wife of R. Walls, or her Heirs; the other parts
I give to Dr. Vernon P. Jones, ~~or~~ his heirs

The slaves which I lost by the U. S. Army and their increase if ever
got, I desire to be sold by my Execr: V. P. Jones, and 5 per cent com deducted
for my Execr:, and the net proceeds to be divided into four equal parts, the one
fourth I give to my son, W. M. Drake, one fourth to my daughter Martha
Roach, one fourth to Mrs. Mary Walls, and the other fourth to Dr. Vernon P.
Jones

I do hereby nominate and appoint Dr. Vernon P. Jones as Executor of this
my last will and testament, and I do hereby revoke and make void, all
former wills, testaments or deeds or conveyances by me at any time made,
and do hereby declare this to be my last will & Testament.

In witness whereof I the said testator Robert Drake, have to this my last
will and testament set or cause to be set my hand and seal this the twenty

ninth of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty four.

Roach and Martha T. his wife, heirs and distributees of the said Robert Drake deceased by their counsel who desire to contest the probat of said will, it is ordered by the Court that they be admitted as defendants to contest the probat of said will, and on the further motion of the said heirs and distributees of said Robert Drake it is ordered that the motion of the said Vernon P. Jones to record the said paper be continued till the next term.

And again in New Kent County Court on the 13th day of October, 1865.

produced in Court by Vernon P. Jones, the writer thereon named in order
to be heard, and Mr. M. Drake and Chas. T. Roach, and Martha F.
his wife, heirs and distributees of the estate of said Robert Drake, appeared
and opposed the proof of the said will, whereupon divers witnesses were
sworn and examined and the parties aforesaid by their counsel fully heard
on consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court that the said Robert Drake
decd, at the time of executing the writing aforesaid, dated the 29th day of
March, 1864, was of sound and disposing mind and memory, and that
he was under no undue influence. And Burwell B. Jones and James R.
Taylor, the surviving witness to the said writing having testified in
Court that the said Robert Drake signed and published the same in
their presence as and for his last will and testament, that they sub-
scribed their names as witnesses thereto, in the presence of the Testator
at his request and in the presence of each other and that the said Testator
was of sound mind and memory as far as they knew or believed; and having
also testified that they saw Benjamin Timberlake one of the other wit-
nesses to the said writing, who is now dead, subscribe his name thereto
also in the presence of the said testator at his request, and that the said
Benjamin Timberlake signed the name Robert Drake to the said will
at the request of the said Robert Drake in his presence and in the
presence of the said B. B. Jones and James R. Taylor, it is ordered that
the said writing of the 29th day of March, 1864, be recorded as the
last will and testament of the said Robert Drake, deceased.
