Secondly - I give to my son, Maun W. Timberlake, the sum of two hun-  
dred dollars - To my daughter Sarah W. Bourry the sum of one hundred dollars  
and to my daughter Elizabeth A. Marable the sum of one hundred dollars

Thirdly - I give to my daughter Jane all my furniture

Fourthly - The rest and residue of my estate no matter of what it may  
consist I give to my five children William F. Timberlake, Maun W. Timberlake,  
Jane F. Timberlake, Martha R. Timberlake and Mary W. Clarke, to be equally  
divided between them. The portion given Mary W. Clarke, I will & desire to be held  
by her husband William R. Clarke in trust for her benefit during her life at

her death to be equally divided between her descendants "per stirpes". This provision is not made for any want of confidence in or affection for my son in law, William R. Black.  
Lastly - I nominate, constitute and appoint Richmond T. Lacy, Executor of this my last will and testament.
