

- I, Sarah A. Foster of New Kent County, in the State of Virginia, being in bad health, and of sound mind do make this to be my last will and testament hereby enjoining and revoking any and all wills by me heretofore made.

First. My will and desire is that all of my just debts, be paid out of my estate as soon after my death as it can conveniently be done.

Second. After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give to my husband, Josiah Foster every thing that remains of my estate real and personal to him and his heirs forever; and all property to which I may be seized and Equitably entitled to, whether in possession, remainder or Expectancy I give to him and his heirs forever.

Third. I constitute and appoint my husband Josiah Foster my sole executor, and request the Court to permit him to qualify as such, without requiring him any security.
