First, I desire that all of my just debts be paid as soon after my death as convenient.

Secondly - I give to my daughter, Lucy A. Hicks one cow

Thirdly, I leave to my daughter, Sarah F. Cumber, her life, and at her death to her heirs a piece of land lying North from my house, and between two swamps.

Fourthly, I give the best of my land to James A. Oley and Martha R. Oley. I give to Martha R. Oley one last years calf and one bractee.

I give James A. Oley one horse and one Beaufort

I give to Francis H. Stewart and James H. Stewart one dollar.

Fifthly, I give to James A. Oley & Martha R. Oley my crockery ware and cooking utensils &c.

Sixth and lastly I appoint my son, James A. Oley, executor of this my last will and testament. Signed, sealed and acknowledged in the presence of us as witnesses our hands & seal this the 27th of May 1878

deceased, was presented in Court, proven by the oaths of B. H. Walker,

therein named, he has leave to qualify. Whereupon he executed a
bond with George W. Crump and Ed. E. Boswell his securities, in
the penalty of seventy five dollars, conditioned according to law—
