

I Susan B. Boyster of the County of New Kent and State of Virginia do make this my last will and testament. In the first place I leave to my daughter Ann S. Savage the house in which I now reside, and the lots adjacent, lawn, garden pear and spring lots, to have and hold the same during her life. Should she remain unmarried, in the event of the death or remarriage of my daughter Ann S. Savage then the above named property shall be disposed of as my will hereafter directs. I also will and direct that my daughter Ann S. Savage have the privilege of getting fire wood from any other lands for consumption on the premises. I give to my daughter Ann S. Savage one bed and bedstead in chamber, all my bed clothes, sideboard and castors, mantle ornaments, rocking chair and chairs in parlor, all my fruit baskets, my best tumble cart, and stock and fowls of every description to her and her heirs forever. I give to my son George M. Boyster my portable desk. To my son William Boyster, I give my little desk on the mantle and twelve dollars to be laid out in a silver cup. I give to my son Lytleton Boyster Twelve dollars to be laid out in a silver cup. I give to my daughter Harriet Yeatman one silver can, one little Mahogany table in the chamber, one easy chair and rocking chair in the chamber. I give to my daughter Ellen Boyster one silver can, bureau, bedstead over the parlor and one clock. I give to my son Lawrence Boyster all my lands not heretofore

can. bureau. be dead over the father and the mother
To my son Lawrence Royster all my lands not heretofore
disposed of to him and the issue of his body forever.
likewise the lands bequeathed to my daughter Ann S. Savage
at her death or intermarriage. But should my son
Lawrence Royster die leaving no issue, then I will and
direct that the property given to him above, shall go unto
the person of my daughter Ann S. Savage, if living
and unmarried, and at her death or marriage to be
equally divided between my daughters Harriet Yeatman
and Ellen Southall. But should my daughter Ann S. Sav-
age be dead or married, and my son Lawrence Royster
dying without issue, then the property given to him above
shall go to my daughters Harriet Yeatman and Ellen Southall
to them and their heirs forever. I give to my son Lawrence
Royster my mahogany stand in the chamber, my wagon
and wheat machine and farming utensils to him and
his heirs forever. I will and direct that all monies coming
to my estate be equally divided between my three daughters
Ann S. Savage, Harriet Yeatman and Ellen Southall.

I appoint my son George W Royster the executor of this my
last will and testament, as witness my hand and seal
this day of 1870 Seal
