In the name of God Amen. I William A. Pollard of
New Kent County in the State of Virginia being sick
and weak in body but of sound and disposing mind
memory and understanding, considering the certainty
of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and
being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby
be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall
please God to call me hence, do therefore make and
publish this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following, that is to say: First and principally
I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God,

my debts and funeral charges are paid. I give devise
 and bequeath all the real and personal residue of my estate
 real personal and mixed to my Brother Thomas H. Pollard
 in trust and confidence nevertheless for my dearly beloved
 wife Rebecca Ann Pollard, so long as she may live, and
 after her death. I will that whatever portion of my estate
 may remain, if any, shall be divided between the children
 of my said Brother Thomas H. Pollard and my sister Mrs Mary
 Ellen Harley, in equal portions, share and share alike; But
 whereas my wife is supposed to be enfeebled by me, and
 may before many months be delivered of a child or children
 I will that if such should be the case and said child or
 children should live, that all my estate, real, personal and
 mixed shall be used at the discretion of my said Trustee
 for the benefit of my said dearly beloved wife and the said
 child or children that may be born; and in the event
 of my wife marrying I will that if any portion of my
 estate remain that it shall be divided in equal portions
 between my said wife and my said child or children
 one portion of it to be used for the benefit of my said wife
 at the discretion of my said Trustee, and the other portion
 or portions for the benefit of my said child or children
 at the discretion of my said Trustee, and in the event of
 my said wife marrying, I will that the portion due said
 child or children be given to him, her or them upon arriv-
 ing at legal age; and in the event of my said child or

children living, I will that all of my estate, or if my
said wife has married then the portion reserved for her
use, shall be given to my said child or children, at the death
of my said wife, instead of to my brothers and sisters chil-
dren as hereinbefore expressed, I do hereby authorize and
empower my said Trustee Thomas F Pollard to continue or
discontinue my business at Trustalls Station on the Richmond
and York River Rail Road, in New Kent County, State of
Virginia, which I am now engaged in with Alva S. Rich-
ardson, as he in his discretion may see fit and proper
for the benefit of the trust hereinbefore expressed, And
lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear brot-
her Thomas F. Pollard, to be the sole executor of this my last
will and testament, revoking and annulling all former
wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming
this and none other, to be my last will and Testament.

seal, this twenty-fourth day of October in the year eighteen
hundred and seventy.

 The foregoing last will and Testament of William
 A. Pollard deceased, was put into court by Thomas
 F. Pollard the Executor therein named proved by the
 oaths of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered
 to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Thomas
 F. Pollard who made oath to the said will as the
 law directs and entered into and acknowledged
 a bond in the penalty of seven hundred dollars
 with Wm. F. Walker as his security payable to the
 Commonwealth which bond is ordered to be re-
 corded and thereupon certificate is granted
 him for obtaining probate of said will in due
 form of law.
