www.virginiapioneers.net</sup> In the name of God, I, Mr. J. Timberlake, being in bad health but of sound mind, and feeling desirous that Luvenia Makins two chil-
dren Jeff Davis and Robert E. Lee, shall have what I have at my death, I make this
my last will and testament, Viz: I leave to my Bros. and Nephew J. J. Gault
my gold watch at fifty dollars to be paid in specie to my Executor, they jointly to
draw for the watch. I also leave to them, Jeff and Robert, my entire effects, my
interest in the lands belonging to the estate of John Timberlake, decd., to be
placed in the hands of my Executor, whom I make and appoint this day A.
R. Manning to have and to hold until these two boys arrive to the age of
sixteen years, the interest of the monies to be paid annually to Luvenia Makins
for the support of her two children. Given under my hand and seal this
4 day of October, 1865.

In New Kent County Court December 13, 1866.

The foregoing writing purporting the last will and testament of Mr. J. Timberlake, decd. was put into court in order to be proved, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, Buwill B. Jones and Abner B. Walker were sworn, who swearly swore that they were well acquainted with the handwriting of the said Mr. J. Timberlake, and that they believed that the whole of the said will with the signature thereto is in the proper handwriting of the said Mr. J. Timberlake, whereupon the court doth order that the said will be recorded as the last will and testament of said Mr. J. Timberlake, decd.
