One Walnut Table, one feather bed, & furniture, six chairs & my family Bible - and after her death the above named property which I love her. I give to the surviving heirs of her body - 3rd I love to my son John H. Vaider during his life one feather bed, one square table six chairs, one low, and at his death to the nearest issue of my family; 4th I love to my Daughter Mary J. Vaider, one feather bed & stead & furniture, one small Walnut Table, one desk, six chairs six knives & forks, one sewing Stove and one large stove, one spinning wheel and if she should die leaving no lawful issue of her body, it is my wish that the above named property go to the surviving heirs of my daughter

Knives and forks, One choice lawn, one spinning wheel and
choice pitcher, Two blue ad. one Colico Spinn. Two bed quilts.
Pier and basket, one glass table plate, six Salt Stands and
one wash stand pitcher and hole to her and heirs forever

to be divided in the same way between my four children
and at their death to go to the nearest issue of my family
