Two blue and one calico spread. two bed quilts. Rugs and blanket. One glass butter plate, six salt strands and one wash stand pitcher and bowl to her and her friend Dr. I leave to my Daughter Fluviana A. Herrman during her natural life one choice bofar. One Walnut Table, one feather bed, & furniture, six chairs & my favorite Rugs - and after her death the above named property which I leave her. I give to the surviving heirs of her body - 2nd I leave to my son John H. Vaiden during his life one feather bed, one square Table six chairs, one bowl, and at his death to the nearest issue of my family, 3rd I leave to my daughter Mary J. Vaiden, one feather bed and furniture, One small Walnut Table, one desk, six chairs, six knives & forks, one sleeping Stab and one large Grasp. One spinning wheel and if she should die leaving no lawful issue of her body, it is my wish that the above named property go to the surviving heirs of my daughter.

to be divided in the same way between my four children
and at their death to go to the nearest issue of my family.

I appoint Young & Mathews Adm'rs of this my last will and testament this the 10th day of June one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.
