Red the inside Green with two Tills my Mahogany Desk my
Silver watch made by Benjamin Danks 14th of Novr 1735

the inside green with two silks my Mohogany Desk my
Silver watch made by Longers Dorlop of London Number 3035.
to him the said John Williams Scott and his Heirs for ever.

Notwithstanding the aforesaid Paragraph of the said John
Williams Scott should Die before the Twentieth Day of March
One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty eight years without
issue living at his Death at which Time the aforesaid John
Williams Scott will be Twenty One Years of Age then the whole
of his part at his Decease shall go to his sister my Daughter Susan
Cockburn Scott and her Heirs for Ever.

said Mother during her Natural Life.

102. Codicil to my last will and Testament

I give and bequeath to my son John Williams Scott all my wearing apparel to be sold for his Account, in Case he dont appear in Norfolk, Twelve Months after my Decease,

I also give and bequeath to the said John Williams Scott after the Decease of my Loving Mother Margaret Baine and failing my Daughter Susan Cockburn Scott, and the Heirs of her Body, that part of my Estate Real and personal which I bequeathed her in the foregoing Will: And failing the Heirs of the Body of my said son John Williams Scott and after the Death of my Mother and Death of my Daughter Susan Cockburn Scott and her Issue; I give my Estate Real and Personal to my Nephews Robert and Alexander Scotts Sons to my Brother Capt John Scott to be Equally divided between them — Norfolk in Virginia
