of Ten Pounds Current Money of Virginia and that to be paid by the Executors
towards her schooling and Maintenance according as they shall see Occasion
for the same. Likewise I give unto the said Mary Holmes all my wearing
Apparel in general except one black Bumbay gown and one black
velvet Cloak. I freely give to my Sister Ann Seed.

Item I give and Bequeath unto John Sewelling son of John Sewelling One painted
corner Book

I have unto John Sewelling son of John Sewelling (now painted)
corner Book Case. And as for the residue of my Estate my Will and desire is
that it all should be sold to the highest Bidder at a publick Vendue and the
Money to be equally divided Between my Two Sons John Holmes & William
Sewelling. Furthermore my Will and Desire is that my trusty friends John
Sewelling and John Grant should be my Executors of this my last Will and
Testament hoping they will take care and see the same performed according
