the uncertainty of all Human Events do make this my last Will and
Testament in manner following, hereby Revoking all former Wills
by me made, And first I Reassign my Soul to the Great & most Mercifull
God that made it, and my Body I Commit to the Grave, As for my Temporal
Estate and Goods, I Give and Dispose of the same as followeth, viz.

Imprimis I direct that the Sum of Eight hundred pounds Sterling, be put
into the Hands of Mr James Donald Murch in Greenock, and by him
to be set out on Interest for the Benefit of my Father & Mother During
their Lives, or the Life of either of them, to be Annually paid unto them
by the said James Donald, and after the Death of my Parents, I Give and
Bequeath the said Sum of Eight Hundred pounds Sterling to be equally
Divided between their Sisters Children and my Cousin Robert White, That
is to say, that the said Robert White shall Receive the same Proportion
thereof as each of the said Children.

Item I Give and Bequeath to the Borough of Norfolk my Interest in the Town Bount Company, also the sum of fifty pounds Current Money of Virginia, towards the Purchase of a Publick Clock, to be fixed on a New Court House or a Market Place, if built within fifteen years from this Date, otherwise to Return to my Heirs.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Godson James Young the Sum of One hundred pounds Current Money of Virginia if he should attain to the age of Twenty One years.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Godson Stephen Scott the Sum of One hundred pounds Current Money of Virginia if he should attain to the age of Twenty One years.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Godson John Walker son of Anthony Walker Jun^r of Prince Anne my land and House in Newtown, for which M^r James Gibson of Suffolk has engaged to answer the debt of the said John Walker Jun^r already

Item I Give and Bequeath to the Borough of Norfolk my Interest in the
Town Boint Company, also the Sum of Fifty pounds Current Money of

made him Satisfaction for the same, as will appear by my Books. I also
Give and Bequeath to my Godson John Walke the Sum of Twenty pounds
Current

Current Money of Virginia (to purchase a Mourning Ring) My Gold Watch, My Gold Ring, my Silver Handled Hanger and all my Books except Smollets History of England, which I give to his Brother Anthony Walke. If my Godson John Walke should die before he attains to the Age of Twenty One years, then I give and Bequeath the abovementioned Land, House Watch and other things Devised to the said John Walke unto his Brother William Walke, in Case of whose Death before he Attains to the age of Twenty One years, I Give and Bequeath the said Land, House, Watch and other Things, unto Anthony Walke Son of Anthony Walke Jun^r of Princeps Anne, except the Gold Watch, which in that Event I give unto the oldest Son of Maj^r John Hendale of Northampton and his Male Heirs.

Item I Give and Bequeath to Mrs Mary Nicholas the Ballance she may owe me at the Time of my Death.

Item I Give and Bequeath to Mrs Jane Hanks worth the Sum of Ten Pounds Current Money of Virginia.

Item I Give and Bequeath to Richard Collinson the Sum of Ten Pounds Current Money of Virginia.

Item I Give and Bequeath to John McLean the Sum of Ten Pounds Current Money of Virginia and all my Wearing Apparel.

Item I Give and Bequeath to Anthony Walke Junr. Esq^r. the Sum of Ten Pounds Current Money of Virginia to purchase a Mourning Ring.

All the Remainder of my Estate both Real and Personal, I desire may be Equally Divided amongst the Children of my Father and Mothers, Sisters and my Cousin Robert White, that is to say that the said Robert White shall Receive the same Proportion thereof as each of the other Children.

If Bills of Exchange should Exceed Forty five Cent in Virginia, I desire my Executors may Remit what Money I have directed to Great Britain by the Way of the West Indies, or by any other Method they may judge best.

I hereby Appoint Anthony Walke Junr. Esq^r. of Princess Anne, Mr. Archibald White of Mr John McLean Merchants in Norfolk, Mr James Donald Merchant in Greenock and Mr Thomas Donald late Merchant in Warwick Executors of this my Last Will. In Witness whereof I have hereto set my Hand and Affixed my Seal this Twenty Eighth Day of June in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Sixty three.
