Item I further give my Wife One half of all my Household and Kitchen Furniture
together with one third of what Money that may arise from the Settlement
of my Accts. after all my Debts are Paid, the Rest, Residue & Remainder
of the Money, Goods & Chattels to be divided Between my Two Sons, but
in such a Manner that each of them shall have there

I further give my Wife One half of all my Household and Kitchen Furniture together with one third of what Money that may arise from the Settlement of my Accts. after all my Debts are paid, the Rest, Residue & Remainder of the Money, Goods & Chattels to be divided Between my Two Sons, but in case of the Death of either of my Sons before they arrive of Age their Part of this my Estate to be divided between my Wife and the surviving Son and if they both die before they arrive of Age the whole to go to my Wife & her Heirs for ever. Lastly I appoint my Worthy Friends Samuel Bacon Nicholas Wenterton and Griffen Beart to assist my Wife in the Administration of this my Will. In Witness of which I have sealed it with my Seal & signed with my Name this 28th day of June in the Year of our Lord God 1765.
