I do hereby appoint, nominate and ordain my trusty and well beloved Friend Mr Thomas Morgan Executor of this my last Will and Testament, Revoking all former Wills, Deeds of Gift &c. by me at any time heretofore made, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this Twenty eighth Day of May in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and sixty eight.
