Testament that is to say First of all I Give my Soul into the  
Hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body to the  
Earth to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion  
of my Executors nothing doubting but a <sup>the</sup> General Resurrection I  
shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God. As  
Touching my Worldly Estate wherewith it please God to bless me  
in this Life I Give Devise and Dispose of the same in the follow-  
ing manner and form.

First I Give & Bequeath to my son John Guy the House & half the  
Land with Nanny Sarah & Mingo to him & his Heirs Lawfull  
begot of his Body.

Also I give <sup>to</sup> my Beloved Son Baley Guy the other half of the Land I Bought of William Guy with Sue a Negro Wench & Jenny another Negro to him and his Heirs Lawfully Begotten. If he dies without an Heir the Land shall be Henry Guy & the Negroes to Betty Guy.

Also I give to my son Henry Guy two Negro's Beck & Mitchell to him and his Heirs Lawfully Begotten. If Henry Guy dies without an heir the Negro's shall be Betty Guy.

Also all the Silver and Gold I have in my House shall be Equally Divided among my Children which is about Fifteen Pounds.

Also I give to my Beloved Daughter Betty Guy three My ~~in~~ Tom. Agg & Sharper to her and her Heirs of her Body Lawfully Begotten. If she dies without an Heir the Negroes shall be Henry Guy. she shall have also one bed and furniture.

And all the Rest of my moveable Estate shall be sold and Divided among my Children. — And I do hereby utterly disallow Revokes and Disanull all and every other Former Testaments, Wills, Legacies,

And all the Rest of my moveable Estate shall be sold and Divided among  
my Children. — And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and

Bequeaths & Execut<sup>n</sup> by me in any ways before named Willed &  
Bequeathed ratifying and confirming this to be and no other  
to be my last Will and Testament I Witness whereof I have  
handed

hereto set my hand and seal  
January in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred  
and Sixty three.
