

In the Name of God Amen I Charles Smallwood of Norfolk county in the State of Virginia black
smith being of sound and disposing mind the infirm of Body do make and ordain this to be my
last will and testament in the manner and form following viz. —

First I give and bequeath the Brick dwelling house I now live in and Lot belonging thereto, as —
determined by the division stones now standing thereon to my wife Ann for her natural Life, &
after her death to Thomas Pitson and Edmund Almonds of Norfolk county and my son Jm^r Smallwood
of Charles City in Trust for the sole use and benefit of my eldest son Joseph Smallwood and the
heirs of his Body lawfully begotten forever, to be made over to my said son Joseph or his said
heirs or sold or otherwise disposed of for his or their use and agreeable to his or their direction
whenever requires by the said Joseph Smallwood or his said heirs except my said wife Ann —
survives my said son Joseph or his said heirs and in that case it is my will that the said house
shall be sold after my said wifes death and the money divided equally betwixt my two daughters
Ann and Isabell Smallwood and their Heirs forever. or in case my said son Joseph or his said heirs
should be incapacitated by the laws of this State from holding or enjoying the said house & Lot, or
that it cannot be sold by the above mentioned trustees Thomas Pitson, Edmund Almonds, John
Smallwood or their agents or assigns and the proceeds remitted to him or his said heirs, then and
in that case it is my will that the said house and Lot be sold and the money arising therefrom be

equally divided betwixt my said daughters Ann and Isabell Smallwood and their heirs forever. —

Secondly I give and bequeath the House lately occupied by Mr Edmund Almonds with the Smiths tools shop and tools, and Lot they now stand upon, bounded by a division stones now standing thereon to my second son John Smallwood and his heirs forever, also all my Lot or Lots of Land at Newtown in the county of Princeps unto my said son John and his heirs forever. —

Thirdly I give and bequeath my negro wench Jude, to my said daughter Ann Smallwood and wench Sarah in case she returns or can be brought home from the enemy, if not my Boy Jim to my said daughter Isabell Smallwood and their heirs forever, to be delivered to them my said daughters on their marriage in case that should happen before my said wifes decease if not, they are to take possession of said wench or wenches or boy at her death. —

Fourthly It is my will and desire that the Remainder of my negroes named Annistead, Matt, Rose, and Jim in case Sarah returns home, Cesar and Bob to be at the disposal of my said wife Ann during her ~~natural~~ life, also my horse, cows and hogs and all the House and kitchen furniture and utensils, Beds, and Bedding — likewise Annisteads hire due from Mr Thomas Pleasant and co. for the purpose of defraying funeral charges laying in winter provisions &c, and the two Lots of Land at ferry point lately purchased of Henry Herberts estate and Argyll Herbert. —

Fifthly I give and bequeath the two Lots of Land at ferry point aforesaid to be equally divided after my wifes death betwixt my two said daughters Ann and Isabell Smallwood and their heirs forever. —

Sixthly I give and bequeath the negroes named Annistead, Matt, Rose and Jim in case Sarah returns home Cesar, and Bob to be equally divided betwixt all my said children Joseph, John, Ann and Isabell and their heirs forever, after my wifes death and after payment of all my just debts, and the outstanding debts due

wife's death beviest my two said daughters Ann and Isabell Smallwood and their Heirs forever. —
Sixthly I give and bequeath the negroes named Amistead, Matt. Rose and Jim in case Sarah returns home
basar, and Bob to be equally divided betwixt all my said children Joseph, John, Ann and Isabell and their
Heirs forever, after my wife's death and after payment of all my just debts, and the outstanding debts due
me, are collected the proceeds are to be equally divided between my wife Ann and said children Joseph, —
John Ann and Isabell and their Heirs forever, and the remainder of my personal estate I give to be equally
divided betwixt my said children Joseph, John Ann and Isabell and their Heirs forever. —

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint Thomas Pitt on of the Borough of Norfolk and Edmund Almon of
the county of Norfolk, executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this second day of November one thousand seven hundred and eighty one. —
