I give and bequeath to my loving wife Frances Thomas one half of my estate after my just debts are paid, she having her choice of all the slaves, so as to share one half of them. I also give her all my household and kitchen furniture, plate, chariot, and two chariot horses to her and her heirs forever. —

I give to my friend Alexander Mosley two negro men called George and Will bought from — Randolph — to him and his heirs forever. —

I give the land bought from Tresman in Norfolk to my wife Frances Thomas during her life and after her death to my friend Alexander Mosley and his heirs forever. —

I give the rest of my slaves after my wife has chosen her half to be equally divided between John Hutchings ^{Junior} son of John; Sally Ramsay daughter of John Ramsay, Isabella Helsick, daughter of Richard Helsick and Amy Newton daughter of Thomas Newton Junior to them and their heirs forever. —

I give to my loving wife over and above the half of my personal estate the sum of three hundred pounds in order that she may build a house for her accommodation. —

I give all the rest of my estate not before devised I give to be equally divided between my friends Alexander Mosley, John Hutchings Junior ^{son} of John, Sally Ramsay, Isabella Helsick, Amy Newton & Sarah Hutchings daughter of Joseph Hutchings to them and their heirs forever. — Lastly I nominate & appoint my friends Thomas Newton Junior, and Alexander Mosley executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twen-

Item I give to my friend Alexander Mosley two negro men called George and Will bought - from -
Randolph - to him and his heirs forever. -

Item I give the land bought from Freeman in Norfolk to my wife Frances Thomas during her life
and after her death to my friend Alexander Mosley and his heirs forever. -

Item I give the rest of my slaves after my wife has chosen her half to be equally divided between John
Hutchings ^{Junior} son of John, Sally Ramsay daughter of John Ramsay, Isabell a Hetsick, daughter of
Richard Hetsick and Amy Newton daughter of Thomas Newton Junior to them and their heirs
forever. -

Item I give to my loving wife over and above the half of my personal estate the sum of three
hundred pounds in order that she may build a house for her accommodation. -

Item All the rest of my estate not before devised I give to be equally divided between my friends Alexander
Mosley, John Hutchings Junior ^{son} of John Sally Ramsay, Bella Hetsick, Amy Newton & Sarah
Hutchings daughter of Joseph Hutchings to them and their heirs forever. - Lastly I nominate &
appoint my friends Thomas Newton Junior, and Alexander Mosley executors of this my last will
and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twen-
ty ninth day of October one thousand seven hundred and eighty three. -
