to return to my Wife Elizabeth Moseley and her inheritance if  
my Daughter Elizabeth Moseley should live to be married  
then my Will is that she should have the above named Negro  
Tom & Jude and Peggy and all there inheritance forever and  
one half of my personal Estate I Give to my said Daughter  
Elizabeth Moseley after my just debts are paid Except my  
silver beathed sword to her & her heirs forever

to return to my wife Elizabeth Moseley and her increase & half of  
my Daughter Elizabeth Moseley should live to be married  
then my wife it that she should have the above named Negro  
Rump & Judah and Peggy and all their increase for ever and  
one half of my personal Estate I Give to my said Daughter  
Elizabeth Moseley after my just debts are paid Except my  
silver heathen sword to my said her heirs forever  
I Give & bequeath to my Son William Moseley my  
Negro Woman named Phillis my negro boy named Jack & my  
Negro Girl named Rahmy my English boy named Robin my Lot  
of Land at the Cross Roads I bought of Charles Tenby and one  
Plantation in Princess Anne County I bought of Colo. Underhill  
my Dollars and my silver heathen sword I Give to my son  
William Moseley & his heirs forever  
I Give & bequeath to my two Brothers William and  
Marshall Moseley all my out side wearing Apparel  
I Give to my sister Mary Snell one Gold Ring  
I nominate & appoint my loving wife Elizabeth
