In the Name of God Amen. I am William of Norfolk County being of  
sound mind and perfect memory thank be to god for his grace and wisdom this  
my last will and Testament in the manner and form following that is to  
say first I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty god my  
heavenly father by whom of his grace and grace must to be saved  
and delivered from eternal death through the death of my saviour our

Redeemer Jesus Christ in whose precious blood I set  
the whole and only hope of my salvation and my body  
in hopes of a joyful Resurrection I commit to the  
earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my  
executor hereafter named and touching the dis-  
position of all my temporal estate I give and dispose  
thereof in the manner and form following I desire  
that all my debts and funeral charges shall be paid  
and discharged I give devise and bequeath my  
son Edward Halestead one pair of water mill stones  
and two hundred and odd acres of land in the  
fork of Peckotank to him his heirs and assigns for  
ever which he has had in possession sometime  
before this my will was made I give devise and  
bequeath to my son Drew Halestead a tract of land  
containing two hundred and odd acres and  
ever and always to him his heirs and assigns for  
ever I give devise and bequeath to my son John  
Halestead one hundred and sixty four acres of

land adjoining to James Wilson Senr. to him his  
heirs and executors forever I give devise and be-  
queath to my son Samuel Halestead the land that

I now live on from a Chickepin tree standing on the  
side of a branch or run out from the icee running  
straight course to a partition tree standing near a  
few grape trees that stands on the back side of my  
corn field ... from the icee running straight course  
out at the head of my land but if it please God that  
my aforementioned son Samuel should die not  
leaving any lawful issue it is my desire that  
my son John Halestead should inherit the part as-  
signed to him for ever but if a lawful issue should  
appear it is to remaine to the said sonne Samuel  
and his heirs forever I give devise and bequeath to

my son Samuel Halestead two islands adjoining  
to my land the Bestree Island and the Wolf Island  
during his natural life and afterwards it is  
my deede that my son Thomas should inherid

and possess same no man can ever give away  
device and bequeath to my son Thomas Halstead  
all the remaining part of my land that I now  
live on from the aforementioned Chukepint,  
running a straight course to a marked pine  
now tree and from thence to a new line that I  
intended to make and if not made the aforemen-  
tioned line runs a straight course out at the head  
of my land to him his heirs and assigns forever.  
I give device and bequeath to my son Samuel Hal-  
stead his heirs and assigns forever one Negro fellow  
named Joe and one Negro boy named Charles two  
oil tables one looking glass one dozen leather  
one chest of drawers and one bed, and furniture.  
likewise it is my desire that my son Samuel and  
my daughter now living unmarried should  
have the use and benefit of my negro until my  
son Samuel arrives to the age of twenty one years  
but if any of my daughters should marry it is my  
desire that they should have only the part that

desire that they should have my negroes  
shall be assigned to them in this my last will  
and testament but if my aforementioned son  
Samuel should die not leaving any lawful issue  
then that the negro named Charles should be  
equally divided among three of my daughters  
that is Mary Love and Elizabeth to them  
and in case of no lawfull issue I desire that  
my daughter Elizabeth should have the above  
mentioned Chest of drawers she and her heirs  
forever and that my daughter Gena should have  
the small oyle table she and her heirs forever  
and that my daughter Love should have the  
large table she and her heirs and that my  
daughter Mary should have the dozen of leather  
chairs aforesaid she and her heirs forever  
likewise it is my desire that Samuel should  
have one pair of hand mill stones and one  
notch pot and one small Pott to him his heirs

my daughter Ann Reed her heirs and assigns forever  
one negro fellow named Ned I give devise and be-  
queath to my daughter Elizabeth Halestead her heirs  
and assigns forever one negro wench named Negar  
and her offspring and one bed and furniture and one  
black racing mare I give devise and bequeath to my  
daughter Jan Halestead her heirs and assigns forever  
one negro wench named Abby and her child named  
Easter and their offspring and one bed and furniture  
and one racing mare I give devise and bequeath to  
my daughter Fannie Halestead one negro wench named  
Flora and her offspring and one bed and furniture  
to her heirs and assigns forever I give devise and  
bequeath to my daughter Mary Halestead her heirs  
and assigns forever one negro girl named Tyddie and  
one bed and furniture and the negro's offspring and  
one horse colt named Dolphin I give devise and be-  
queath to my son John Halestead his heirs and as-  
signs forever one negro boy named Levy and one

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digree forever all my property man  
bed and furniture now in my possession likewise  
one hundred of land adjoining to land of James Ballance  
swear up and affirm you John Stead deceased not  
leaving any land or estate then that the negro  
boy named Levy should be the son of Samuel Hale  
Stead and his heirs forever. I give devise and  
bequeath to my son Lattimore Hale stead his heirs and  
descendents forever one negro boy named Roger but if  
my said son Lattimore should die not leaving any  
lawful issue then said negro Roger is to be sold  
or valued and my daughter Mary to have twenty  
Pounds Virginia Currency of his value and the  
remainder of the said fellow's price is to be equally  
divided among my other three daughters now un-  
married. I give devise and bequeath that my daughters  
now unmarried should have the use of both my  
rooms with their brother Samuel and likewise  
that my daughters should have the use of my

syphosis swaup as long as they live. Unmar  
red and afterward it is my desire that  
my son Thomas and Jane should inherit  
the said swaup they and their heirs forever.  
And that all my horses cattle sheep and hogs shoule  
be for the use of my daughters and my son James  
and their heirs but if any of my aforementioned  
daughters should leave their sisters and rest  
be married that they should have their pro  
portionable part of the ~~keeper~~ <sup>keeper</sup> of the ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> goods  
as long as they live unmarried and if in  
either of them should marry they are to have  
the part which haue been assigned to them and  
not to expect any more benefit of the said estate.  
And all the rest of my personal estate goods and  
chattels I give to my son James and Thomas  
Toke poide my loving sons Simon & Thomas Haunte  
to be my whole and sole executors of this my  
last testament and do hereby revoke all former  
and past writings wills and testaments

last testament and do hereby revoke the same  
and void all former wills and testaments by  
me heretofore made either by word of mouth or in  
writing in witness the said Drew Halstead t.  
this my last will and testament have set my  
seal this twentyfifth day of February in the year  
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
one.
