my last will & testament in manner followinge. First I commend my soule unto
God Almightie my maker, & to Iesus Christ my onely saviour & redemptor: & my
bodie to be buried in decent buriall. I bequeath for my personall estate, my debts &
small charges beinge first paid & discharged, I give & bequeath unto Thomas
Branche of y^e same parish, all & singler my goods & rattle household stuffe all debt
due to me. I give by my will & desire is y^e John Subbitt shall have house &
garment for himselfe & another duringe y^e terme of the lease fourth
my will & desire is y^e John Browne servant to Thomas Branch at y^e Expiration
of his tyme for to have a heifer of two yeeres old, fifth my will & desire
is y^e Mandinge & my daughter to Mary Tempe will shall have a cowe value
was valued in March last past recorded y^e next Court after my decease for y^e said

set their hands & set mine the Third day of November 1651
