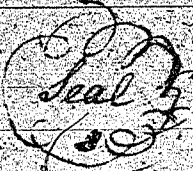

But my will and desire is, that my Grand Son John Robinsons Part of the Money, that will Arise from the sale of my Estate to be put out to Interest with Good security and there kept till my said grandson John Robinson, shall Attain to the Age of Twenty one Years, at which time & not before, I Give the said with all the Interest thereunto my said Grandson John Robinson to his own proper Use.
