thanks be to God for the same do make ~~and~~ ordain constitute and appoint this to be my last will
and testament in manner and form following viz.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand son William Hewlett son of ~~my~~ my son William Hewlett dec'd
one negro Boy called George Salvo give unto my said Grand Son William Hewlett five pounds
current money of Virginia being all I allot for him of my estate.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Hewlett five shillings and all my wearing apparel
to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my ^{Grand} daughter Mary Hewlett daughter of my son Robert Hewlett the
plantation Innow live on running up the river to the first deep Bonamich that runs into the
swamp and from the edge of the swamp a east south east course to my back line, which
said land contains seventy five acres more or less with the appurtenances thereunto belonging
to her and her Heirs forever also my land mill to her and her Heirs forever.

I also give ^{and bequeath} unto my Grand daughter Ann Hewlett daughter of my son Robert Hewlett the
remainder of my old tract of Land not before given which said Land contains seventy five
acres more or less which said Land I give to her and her Heirs forever.

I also give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Frances Baker daughter of my daughter
Sarah Baker one negro man called Ned and one negro girl called Nancy which said

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand son William Hewitt son of ~~my~~ my son William Hewitt deceased one negro Boy called George I also give unto my said Grand Son William Hewitt five pounds current money of Virginia being all I allot for him of my estate. —

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Hewitt five shillings and all my wearing apparel to him and his Heirs forever. —

Item I give and bequeath unto my ^{Grand} daughter Mary Hewitt daughter of my son Robert Hewitt the plantation I now live on running up the run to the first deep Branch that runs into the swamp and from the edge of the swamp a east south east course to my back line, which said land contains seventy five acres more or less with the appurtenances thereunto belonging to her and her Heirs forever also my land mill to her and her Heirs forever. —

I also give ^{and bequeath} unto my Grand daughter Ann Hewitt daughter of my son Robert Hewitt the remainder of my old tract of Land not before given which said Land contains seventy five acres more or less which said Land I give to her and her Heirs forever. —

I also give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Frances Baker daughter of my daughter Sarah Baker one negro man called Ned and one negro girl called Nancy which said negro I give to her and her Heirs forever. —

I also

Also give and bequeath unto my daughter Sapphine Willey twenty eight acres of Land more or less and joining the back line of my old tract, and is the Land I surveyed with William Cooper which said Land I give to my daughter Sapphine to her and her heirs forever. Also give and bequeath unto my said daughter Sapphine Willey one negro boy called Ned and one negro girl called Kate to her and her heirs forever. Also give unto my said daughter Sapphine Willey one negro woman called Juda during her life and all the increase that she has after my decease I give the said negro Juda and all her increase to be equally divided amongst all her children.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Baker seventy five acres of Land more or less as far as the west run it being the Land I bought of Ann Cuthrell which said Land I give to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Baker one negro man called Lewis and one negro woman called Dinah to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Charlotte Hewitt daughter of my son Robert Hewitt two cows and calves one feather Bed and furniture of the best of my Beds one counterpane one sail one chest my ^{wife} brought her one large trunk, one pair of looking glasses.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand son John Willey son of my daughter Sapphine Willey

pair of looking glasses.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand son John Willey son of my daughter Sapphine Willey one negro man called Matto, to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give ~~and bequeath~~ the remainder part of my estate not before given to be equally divided amongst my four ~~children~~ daughters and my grand daughter to wit the said Sapphine Willey, Sarah Baker, Margret Richardson, and my grand daughter Charlotte Hewitt.

Lastly I do nominate and appoint George W. Burgeff James Baker and Josiah Joes my sole executors of this my last will and testament revoking and disannulling all other wills by me before made ratifying and confirming this to be my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of february 1775 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy three.
