son David Hatton the tract of land w^{ch} the plantation over the Creek
which I purchased of Henry Horcutt in the abovesaid County to
him his heirs for ever and also my Pistole and sword & maner
Gun to the abovesaid David Hatton And all the rest of my Estate
both real and personal Goods and Chattels Gold and silver
ready money or household stuff and what silver
I give and bequeath to my loving wife Catharine Hatton
during term of her Widowhood and in case she should think
fitt to marry my Will is that she shall have her third part of
my abovesaid Estate during term of her natural life and after
her Death my Will is that my abovesaid Two sons should have but

half a share & a piece of my personal Estate and all the rest and
Remains of my Estate to be equally divided among the rest of my
Children and further more I appoint my loving wife Catharine
and my loving Brother Robert Hatton Executors of this my last
Will and Testament. In Witness hereof I have set my hand and
fixed my Seal this Tenth day of February one thousand seven
hundred and forty five
