Judy. Amongst my sister Willoughbys Children Elizabeth. Brown
Sarah Willoughby. Mary Willoughby. Peggy Willoughby. George
Abyron Willoughby. Alice Willoughby, and Elizabeth Godfrey Dau-
ghter of James Godfrey, also to dispose of my land by the Name
of Shores amongst the Persons I have mentioned or as she thinks Pro-
per

Item I give and bequeath unto my neice Elizabeth Browne
Daughter of my Sister Willoughby after my wifes decease, my
lot of land in the Borough of Norfolk Joining the Land
of Mr. Saml Boush when I did live, she paying George
Abylon Willoughby, and Mariam Willoughby each the sum
of five hundred pounds, as also four Negroes by Name
Price, Jane, Nancy and Betty Children of Jane which Ne-
groes she has now in her Possession

Item I give and bequeath unto George Abylon Willoughby five
hundred pounds to be paid by Elizabeth Browne to be paid
After my Wifes decease, also a Negro Boy Named Champion
and two lots of Land I bought of Capt. John Smith and at
my Wifes decease my Negro Joe

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Sister Sarah Willoughby a
Negro man named Sam and a Negro named Adam -
which Negroes ^{did} belong to my sister Elizabeth Davis

Item I give and bequeath unto Mariam Willoughby five Negroes

which Negro's ^{did} belong to my sister Elizabeth Davis —
Item. I give and bequeath unto ~~Mariam~~ ^{Mariam} Willoughby ^{five} ~~hundred~~ ^{hundred} ~~pounds~~ ^{pounds} to be paid by Elizabeth Brown after my wife's De.
Also a Negro Girl Named Betty which ~~did~~ belong to my sister Elizabeth Davis —

Item. I give and bequeath unto each of my sister Willoughby's Children after my wife's de^d the sum of three hundred pounds. Sarah, Mary, Peggy and Alice Willoughby. —

Item. it is my will ^{that} if my wife should die without making a Will that what I have give her shall be Equally divided Among my sister Willoughby's Child^{ren} Sarah, Mary, Peggy, George Myron Willoughby, Mariam Willoughby and Alice Willoughby and Elizabeth Godfrey —

Item. I give and bequeath and it is my will that what Estate I have and have not mentioned for my wife to dispose of after her decease shall be divided amongst my sister Willoughby's Children Sarah, Mary, Peggy, George Myron, and Alice Willoughby and Elizabeth Godfrey —

Item I give my will that my Wife shall have all my house and
furniture, and plate to dispose of as she thinks proper, and
Lastly I do appoint my loving Wife Meriam Abyron ^{trustee} Executrix
and Maj^r Henry Brown and Col^l Edward Hack Mosely
and Thomas Newton Jun^r Executors of this my last Will
and Testament. In Witness where of I have set my
