Leah Lemount and my Daughter Elizabeth Lemount to the abovesaid
Children and their Lawful Heirs.

And I desire Nathaniel Burgefs and George Veale may be Guardian to
my two Daughters Leah Lemount and Elizabeth Lemount and I do make
and Ordain George Veale and Nathaniel Burgefs my Executors of this my
last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and disannulling all former
