of Norfolk in the Colony of Virginia being in right mind and sound memory
Thanks be to Almighty God for the same and knowing that it is appointed
to all men once to Dye do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament
in manner and form as followeth — First I Bequeath my Soul into
the Hand of Almighty God that gave it and my Body to the Earth whence it
was taken to be Decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors here-
after mentioned, and for all the Worldly Estate that it hath pleased
Almighty God to Bless me with I do give and Bequeath in manner &
form as followeth —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son John Jameson the Plantation whereon
I now live with the Appurtenances, and one hundred and Forty Acres of more
or less Bounded as followeth, Beginning at a Branch near the Main Road
so up the Branch to the Line between the said Land and the Land formerly
Edward Whithursts, thence up the said Line to the head Line of the said
Land, then along the the said Head line, half way to the

Edward Whiteturks thence up the said Line to the head Line of the said
Land, then along the the said Head line half way to a Ditch then South
by a line of marked trees to the Head line of my now Land then along
the said Head line Easterly to one other line of marked trees near North
to a Ditch then along the Ditch to a Branch between the to old plan-
tations then down the Branch to the Beaver Dam then down the
Dams to the first mentioned Branch to him and his Heirs for ever. -
But in case my said Son John Jameson should die without Issue then the
said Land and Plantation to fall to my son James Jameson to him and his
Heirs, for provided he my said Son James shall pay Sixty six pounds
to be divided between his two Brothers that is to say Henry Jameson
and Stanle Jameson - I als give unto my son John Jameson One
Negro Woman named Doll, Also one Negro Man named Lisbon,
also one Still, one Mare Pleasure, one Desk, my best Gun, one set of
Tea Ware, the second best Bed and and furniture one oval Table, &
after the Decease or Marriage of his Mother my hand Mill - ?

also one Still, one Mare Pleasure, one Deck, my best Gun, one set of
Tea Ware, the second best Bed and and furniture one oval Table, &
after the Decease or Marriage of his Mother my hand Mill and my
Waring apparel to him and his Heirs for ever.
Item I Give and Bequeath unto my son Henry Jameson the Land and
Plantation I bought of Eben Stanle also Fifty Acres be the same

More or less part of my new Land lying between my son John's Land & the Land of Thomas Nash, the whole being One hundred and Forty Acres more or less to him and his Heirs for ever. - Also two Negroes - Lewis and Kate one feather Bed and furniture one oval Table, One Gun to him and his Heirs forever. But in case my son Henry Jameson should dye without Issue his Land to fall to my son James Stanle and his Heirs forever, provided he my said son James shall pay sixty six pounds to be Divided between his two other Brothers.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my son Stanle Jameson after the Decease of my Wife one plantation with one hundred and forty Acres of Land being the Plantation whereon Sarah Stanle Grandmother to my Wife Land be the same more or less, Bounded as followeth on the West and South side with my son John's Land and on the West ^{by} ~~with~~ Samuel Warrington's Land, and on the South with the Head line of my new pattern'd Land and after the Decease of my

Wife the said One hundred and forty acres of Land and Appurtenances
to my said Son Stanley Jameson and his Heirs for ever. I Also
give unto my said son Stanley Jameson after the Decease or Marriage
of my Wife One Negro Man Tom also after the Death of my Wife One
Negro Woman named Patience one feather Bed and furniture One
Gun to him and his Heirs for ever. But in case my son Stanley
should dye without Issue to fall to my son James Jameson and his

short of the hundred to my son James to be equally Divided between
my Four Sons that is to say, John, Henry James and Stanley
Jameson.

Item I give unto my loving Wife Mary Jameson One Negro Woman named
Patience during her Natural life also one Negro Man named Tom
During her single life, also one hand Mill during her single life &
for all the remaining part of my Estate not before given I Give the
Use of to my loving wife during her single life and after her
Decease or Marriage to be equally Divided between my four Sons
John Jameson, Henry Jameson, James Jameson and Stanle
Jameson only that my said four Sons have each his proportional
part of Building a House for my wife to live in on the plantation
where her Grand Mother Sarah Stanly lived Twenty by sixteen with
inside Brick Chimney Plank floor above and below finished
off fit to live in during her Natural life.

And for the true performing every part matter and thing contained
in this my last Will and Testament I do hereby Nominate, Ordain
and Appoint my loving Wife and my Friend Joshua Matthias and
James H. L. 1818

James Holms wholly and jointly Executors and Executrix of this my
Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
