Norfolk being very sick and weak, but of sound Mind and Memory
do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
following, first I give my Soule to God in hopes of a joyfull Resur-
rection at the day of Judgment and my Body to the Earth to be
decently buried at the Discretion of my Exors hereafter named.
And as to what God has been pleased to bless me with I give
as followeth

I give after the decease of my dear Mother, the Land she now
lives on & the Buildings thereto belonging to my Son Hodge
Miller, and to his heirs forever. I give my said Son Hodge Miller
Mingo and Kate to him and his heirs forever in full of his part.
I give to my two Daughters Dinah and Molly each an equal
part having regard to the Buildings of the House of both. I now
live on to them and their heirs forever, but if either die with-
out Issue, the Survivor to enjoy the whole. — — —
I give my Negro Boy Jack to my Daughter Molly & her heirs forever.
I give to my Daughter Dinah — — —

I give my Negro Boy Jack to my Daughter Molly & her heirs forever
I give to my Daughter Dinah my Negro Girl Rachael & to her heirs forever
I give to my wife Eliz^a Miller my Negro Woman Jenny during
her natural life, and after her decease I give my said Negro Woman Jenny
and her future Increase to be equally divided between my three
Children

I give all my household Goods to my wife Elizabeth Miller
My desire is that my Executors dispose of my Negro Man
Sambo, and apply the Money towards the discharge of my debts.
I likewise desire my Father in Law W^m Matt. Godfrey to convey
to Col^d. Samuel Boush, the Land I have his Bond for by lawful
Deeds which will discharge his Bond to me and likewise mine
to the said Boush for the same

I do appoint my loving friends Sam^l Boush and Capt^d Edw^d Pugh
my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20 day of Jan^y 1741/2.
