hold Furniture excepting one Clock with a Walnut Case, and one Mahogany
Desk, and what Plate may be marked in my name, during her Annuel
Life.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Richard Rothery, late of White-
haven at present of the Borough of Norfolk in Virginia my thirty second
part of the Brig^t King George in Whitehaven likewise my Flat and my
Boy Bob and likewise my Land lying on the South side of the Main Street

Boy Bob and likewise my Land lying on the South side of the Main Street leading down to Elizabeth River which was formerly the property of Fodge Miller, Bounded Between Col^d. John Willoughby and Capt. Macfield with what Improvements may be upon it at my Decease to him and and his Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my loving Daughter Mary Rothery in Whitehaven my thirty second part of the Brig Pearl likewise my Negro Man David { after the Decease of my loving Wife Mary Rothery } to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath all the Rest and Residue of my Personal Estate to be Equally Divided between my loving Wife Mary Rothery and my loving Son Richard Rothery and my loving Daughter Mary Rothery of Whitehaven whatsoever and where so ever.

Lastly I do hereby Appoint my Friends M^r. Matthew Rothery and Capt. George Abysson to be my Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby Revoke all former Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Affixed my Seal this Twentieth Day of

May in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty Eight.
