if I should continue to live I will and bequeath unto my former Henry five hundred acres of land
whereon now I do live I do will and bequeath unto my
former Gratia Wood home for two hundred acres of land
lying by the creek and called by the name of Orger
creek I do will and bequeath unto my former John Wood home
two hundred and seventy four acres of land lying and
being at a place called the head of the Dammed. There
be two fields of land in Warrumund 10th I do bequeath unto my
brother in law Mr Charles Solihon but if in case the
said Charles dies without issue of his body I do fully bequeath
then the said land to return to me or my heirs 14th I do

being returned to me. I do likewise will that after
my debts are paid out of my whole estate that then my
