my last Will and Testament in the manner following. In the first place I do nominate and appoint
my Father Gilbert McMechin of Killantringan Mr James Ballantine Merchant in Glasgow and
W John Johnson Merchant in Hanover County York river Virginia to be my sole and only
Executors who shall only be accountable for their Actual Intermeddling, and liable for the
payment of all my just and lawful Debts which thereby desire may be paid out of the
first money arising from my Effects after discharging all my said Debts and after the said
James Ballantine and the said John Johnson have deducted all the Charges and Expences
aburs'd by them in the Execution of this my Will do at present think that from my Share in
the Prince Williams Company of Glasgow from my private Debts due in the Colony of
Virginia from the Negroes flats Houses Lots &c belonging to one there from the Cash I have
left in said Prince Williams Comp^t and lastly including the six thousand Pounds I expect
to receive from my Brother J^t I say from all these by the nearest Calculation I do thin
my self worth about Two Thousand five hundred pounds Sterling which sum more
leaving my Will and desire that my said Father may lend out upon sufficient
Security the Interest of the same made payable to himself and my Mother during
all the Days of their Joint lives and after the decease of either of them to the survivor
during life And at the period of both their deaths I give & Bequeath to my Brother J^t
McMechin of Killantringan the said Principal sum of Ten Thousand five hundred

the Prince Williams Company of Glasgow from my private Debts due in the Colony of
Virginia from the Negroes flats Houses Lots &c belonging to me there from the Cash I have
lent to said Prince Williams Comp^t and lastly including the Six thousand Pounds Geapet
to receive from my Brother I say from all these by the nearest Calculation do thus
my self worth about Two Thousand five hundred Pounds Sterling which sum or
leps it in my Will and desire that my said Father may lend out upon sufficient
Security the Interest of the same made payable to himself and my Mother during
all the Days of their Joint lives and after the decease of either of them to the survivor
during life And at the period of both their deaths I give & Bequeath to my Brother John
McMicken of Hillandean the said Principal sum of Tw^o Thousand five hundred
Pounds Sterling in fee Consenting to the Registration thereof in the Books of
Council and Session or other competent therein to remain for preservation and
there is to be one copy
my Provo^r for witness whereof I have
wrote these Presents upon Stamped paper with my own hand and hanseal
the same at Glasgow this Sixth day of October One thousand Seven hundred
Seventy Eight years
