September 1779. I Isaac Thompson of the County of Norfolk and
Parish of Portsmouth being of sound mind and perfect
do make this my last will and Testament in manner and
manner that is to say I do hereby bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Prudence
and lands and my estate and effects that she
do receive

7 should marry that the stock and moveables to be Equally divided
between my wife prudence, and two children Robert and Ann
my desire is that if my loving wife should think proper to Sell
any of my moveables or stock to the benefit of my Two children Rob-
ert and Ann I empower her so to do.

My desire is that that money which is due to me from Robert
Brown for my house and land Three hundred and thirty three
Pound six shillings and eight pence to be Equally divided betwixt
my two children Robert Thompson and Ann Thompson.
Item I give and bequeath to my son Robert Thompson at the
Time of my wifes marriage or death all that Dwelling house
and lott now in the Town of Portsmouth known by the name
of my big house lying on barr street and court street near
Crab Creech to his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give to my son Robert Fifty acres of Land lying up deep

Crab Creek to his heirs & assigns forever

Item I give to my son Robert L. Fifty acres of Land lying up deep
Creek to his heirs & assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Thompson all the
Double house and Land at the Time of my Wifes marriage or death
to her heirs or assigns forever joining next to Bob. Brown and John
Morris lying on court and County Street and likewise I give to my
Daughter Ann a plantation lying in the western branch join-
ing to Thom. Neale and William Culpeper and if my son Ro-
bert should die without him for my Daughter Ann to possess
the whole and if my Daughter Ann should die without him
then the whole to descend to my son Robert

And lastly I do Appoint my loving wife Prudence and my
son Robert Executors and Executrix of this my last will and
Testament her by revoking all former Wills by me made
