Sum of Twenty pounds to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Robert Cleeves the Sum
of Ten Pounds to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Daughter Elizabeth Cleeves
the Sum of Ten pounds to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I will that if any more Estate it shall be equally divided between

The Sum of Ten pounds to her and her Heirs forever. —

Item I will that if any more Estate it shall be equally divided between my loving wife Mary Cleeves and my loving son Robert Cleeves & my loving Daughter Elizabeth Cleeves to them and their Heirs forever

Item I do appoint and Ordain my loving friend William Smith & Robert Tucker my Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament as Witnesses I have set hereunto set my hand this Tenth Day of December
