Perfect Mind and Memory thanks to Almighty God for the
same Do make and Declare this my present Last Will and
Testament in Manner and form following (that is to say)
First and Principally I recommend my Soul to Almighty
God, who gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence
it was taken to be decently ~~take~~ Buried at the Discretion
of my Executors hereafter Named Hoping through the Merits

Of my Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full & free pardon
and forgiveness of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life
and as touching the Disposition of all such Temporal Estate
as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow on me I give and
Dispose thereof as Followeth

First I will that all my Debts and Funeral Charges be paid
Imprimis I Give and bequeath unto my Son John Furber
and Land he now lives on
the Plantation, containing About Ninety Acres Begin-
ning at a Live Oak corner tree standing in Timothy
Swamp, running up a Branch to a Sweet Gum
then a South and by West course up the Swamp to the
same Wood on Life during his life and after his Death
I Give it to my Grandson John Furber and his Heirs &
in part he gave of an Acre there the said Plantation to
be Inherited in my Grandson Willis Furber and his Heirs
Forever Also I Give and bequeath to my said Son John
my peeps butt saw

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son James Tereba One
Tract or Parcel of Land lying on Deep Creek containing
fifty Acres to the same More or Less Joining on Timothy
Jew's Land and also to the Mill Run Beginning at a Branch
at the Old Mill Landing and Running up the said
Branch to the said Timothy Jew's Line Giving to him
the said James all my Land on the Westward side of
the Mill Run to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Peter Tereba One
Tract or Parcel of Land containing About Twenty five
Acres to the same More or Less Joining to my Son James's
Land Beginning at his Line and Running by a Line of
Marked trees through the Plantation and up the Swamp
to a marked Pine Then Running a South Ward by West Course
to the Head of my Land the said Land Joining to my Son
John's Land, and Timothy Jew's Land to him & his Heirs
forever Also I Give and bequeath to my Son Peter One
Tract or Parcel of Land containing About Twenty five
Acres to the same More or Less Joining to my Son James's
Land Beginning at his Line and Running by a Line of
Marked trees through the Plantation and up the Swamp
to a marked Pine Then Running a South Ward by West Course
to the Head of my Land the said Land Joining to my Son

Bed Also I Give him my Chest and what there is in it
to him and his Heirs

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Sherr
One feather Bed and ^{the} Furniture thereunto belonging being
the Bed whereon my Daughter lies to her and her Heirs
forever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Dinah Trebut
a Parcel of New Feathers which are now in the House

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lydia the Bed
Bed and the furniture thereunto belonging Also I give
her three large Pewter Dishes to her and her heirs for
ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John Ball-
tim five Shillings in full of his Portion he not claiming
in for any Part of my Estate hereafter

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Frances
Trebble one Shilling and her Increase to her and her
heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son James Trebble
the Debt due to me in part of my Deceased at this time
being four Pounds Six Shillings Eight Pence and also
I give him Free Privilege to Manure Houses off my
Land within Twelve Months or in a convenient time
after And as to the Rest of my Personal Estate not already
Willed Away my Will is that the same may be Equally

Divided between my Sons and Daughters And I do hereby
constitute and Appoint my Sons John and James Trustee
Executors of this my Last Will and Testament And hereby
making Void all former Wills by me heretofore made and
Written and this Only to be taken for my Last Will & Testament
