Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife three Feather
Beds and all my House hold and Kitchen furniture
and all my Hogs and Cattle during her Natural Life
and likewise I give to my loving Wife my Two mares
during her natural Life or Case she Marries that she
may have no more and then her Thirds

Item I hereby declare that the Legacies devised to my Wife in this
my Will are Luns of her Power of and in my Estate

Item I give and bequeath to my loving Son James Langley
all the Land lying between the two Roads running to
the Cross Roads and then adjoining to Mrs Elizabeth
Mosley Land unto him and his Heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my loving Son James Langley
another Place of Land adjoining to Mrs Elizabeth Mos-
leys running over the Road unto him and his Heirs
for Ever

Item I give and bequeath to my loving Son James Langley one Negro fellow
Daniel unto him and his Heirs forever and likewise I give

Son James Langley the oldest horse both unto him and his Heirs
Item I give unto my loving Son William Langley my House and Land
-ing as the Maine Road runs unto him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give unto my loving Son William Langley one Negro fellow named
Sam unto him and his Heirs forever and likewise one Mare both
unto him and his Heirs forever

Item I give unto my Four Children Joseph Langley Sarah Langley
Margaret Langley and Thomas Langley all the rest of my
Negros Harry Betty Frank Charles Coffey Bob and young
Negro Boy named Daniel and Negro harrier to be equal Divided
between them when my Son Joseph Langley comes to lawfull
age unto them and their Heirs forever it is my desire if any
of my Four young Children should die before they comes to law-
-full age or before Marriage to be that the Negros be equal
Divided between them

Item I give unto my loving Son Joseph Langley Sarah Langley
Margaret Langley and Thomas Langley the three Negros
that I have named William D. to be equal

Item I give unto my loving Son Joseph Langley Sarah Langley
Margrett Langley and Thomas Langley the three Negroes
that I have bequeathed to my Wife for Death to be equal Divided
between the ~~three~~ after my Wife Death and all their Increase
except the two first that the Negro Isble have I give the do
to my Son James Langley and the next to my Son William
= by to them and their Heirs for ever.

Item I give my devisor Mary Frank Betty Charles Hager to be
hered out to Discharge my just Debts if I should not have
not Money enof till they be all paid.

And Lastly I ordain and appoint my loving Wife Elizabeth
Ann Langley and Capt Mathew Godfrey and M^r. Arthur
Broush and my loving Son James Langley Executors and
Coexecutors of this my last Will and Testament Revoking
all former Wills made In Witnes whereof I have here
= unto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this fifteenth Day
of August One Thousand Seven Hundred and seventy five
