In Woodcock, the said Land to them Divided by a Line from the
River, running through the Middle of the Apple Orchard & so
to the Town Road, the North part of the said Land I give to
my son John Millison as aforesaid, and the other part I give
to my son William Millison as before mentioned, the said
Land always to remain possessed, by the Male heir or heirs
Bearing the Name of Millison.

Secondly I give and Bequeath to my Beloved Wife Amiah
Millison all and Every Part of my Personal
Estate wherewith I am or may be Possessed to
have & to hold the same to her own proper Use
and Benefit to hold & Possess the same all the
time she continues a Widow, and in Case of her
Marriage or Death, she to receive the Benefit &
Value of the third part of my Personal Estate to be
at her own Disposal & Will, the other part to be
Equally Divided Among my ~~Three~~ Youngest
