affirmed In the name of God Amen, I James Thotaball of the Parish
of Elizabeth River, and County of Norfolk in the Colony aforesaid, being in
perfect Health and memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of
this life, do make this, my last Will and Testament in Manner and
form following.

First I give my Soul to God, who gave it me and my Body to the Earth
and Doubting of a joyful Resurrection at the day of Judgment, and as
to what worldly goods, it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give &

Bequeath in manner and form following

I give and Bequeath unto my son James Thelaball my old Plantation that
was formerly my Grandfathers, to the old line and down to the old Hall
to the School House, to the Head dene, I give the same to him and his
Heirs forever, I also give him my old Gun, with a Buckanor Stock, my
Sword and One Leather Bed bolster and Rugg.

I give and Bequeath unto my grandson William Thelaball that part of my
land, joining on his Uncle James Thelaball and so to the Deep Branch
being the Plantation, whereon I now live, I give the same to him and
his Heirs A general

I give and Bequeath unto my Grandson James Griffin a Neck of
Land on the South East side of the Deep Branch, joining to William
Langley's Land I give the same to him and his Heirs forever

I give unto my Daughter Higall Griffin One Leather Bed, Bolster &
Rugg, also my Negro Boy named Kingston, my Negro Boy named
Peter, and my Negro Woman Named Lucy, I give the same to her
and her Heirs forever

I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth bootties, and Negro Man named

Give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Collins, one Negro Man Named
Toby, I Give the same to her and her Heirs for ever.

Give unto my Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball, one Negro Boy
Named Tom, one Negro Girl named Nancy, one Negro Girl named
Bridget, and One Negro Girl named Sally, alias Sarah and that
Increase, to her and the Heirs of her Body, lawfully Begotten forever
but if in case my said Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball Should die
without leaving such Heirs, then I Give the said Negroes to be Equally
Divided, between, my Grandughters, Sarah Griffen, Fanny Griffin
Elizabeth Griffin, and Abigail Griffin, to them and their Heirs for ever.

I also Give unto my said Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball, One Horse, and
sidesaddle, and feather Bed and Furniture, in the Painted Bedstead she
Bought herself, one feather Bed, bolster and Rugg more, one Cow & half
Some Sheep, Marked with an over Heel and under Heel the right Ear,
One Chest, called her Mothers, all the Virginia Cloth she has Spun, or is
spun in my House, at my Decease, all the Earthen Wares, of all sorts,

names some, one Negro girl names Nancy; one negro quenamme
Budget, and one Negro girl named Sally, alias Sarah and that
Increase, to her and the Heirs of her Body, lawfully Begotten forever.

but if in case my said Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball Should die
without leaving such Heirs, then I give the said Negroes to be Equally
Divided, between, my Granddaughters, Sarah Griffen, Fanny Griffin
Elizabeth Griffin, and Abigail Griffin, to them and their Heirs forever.

I also give unto my said Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball, One Horse, and
Side Saddle, and Steathers Beside a good Furniture, in the Quantities abovesaid she
Bought herself, one Feather Bed, Bolster and Rugg more, one Cow & Calf,
some Sheep, Marked with an over Heel and under Heel the right Ear,

One Chest, called her Mothers, all the Virginia Cloth she has Square, or is
Spun in my House, at my Disease, all the Cotton Wares, of all sorts,
she bought them herself all the Barred Fowles, Geese, Turkeys and
Ducks on my Plantation, at my Disease, all the Cotton, Wool and Flax,
One Spining Wheel, three pair of Cotton and Wool Cards, One washbowl,
Tin, One looking Glass, a candle, Salt and dye Tub, all the Meat and

154^o Come on my Plantation at my Dwelling, all the above-mentioned Articles &
Give to my said Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball and her Heir for ever,
Also Give to my said Daughter Sarah Dyer Thelaball, the Use of
the Plantation, I divide during her single life.

And as to the Remainder of my Estate, best of what Nature or kind
soever I give the same, after any just Debts and paid to be equally
(Divided among all my Children, that shall be living at my Death
Deducting a sufficient sum to Bury me in a Decent & Christian
manner.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my Son James
Thelaball, and my Son in Law John Griffin, Executors of this my
last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and affixed my Seal this Fourteenth day of August
Seventeen Hundred and Fifty Eight.
