between of of lands given to of of Warden is to him & his heirs for ever & four thousand wt
of each Part to be paid out of my Stock & one small feather bed & my great Coat. Item I give
& bequeath to my well beloved son Samuel Warden of Plantation I now live with all the rest
of my lands I now hold to him & his heirs for ever with my still & all belonging to her
Item I give & bequeath to my well beloved Elizabeth Warkiff five shillings being in full of what
she has already received of all her Portion. Item I give & bequeath to my well beloved
Daughter Margaret Whitehead my Negro boy called Jo to her & her heirs for ever with one
black horse called Puppy & one small Feather Bed. Item I give & bequeath to my well beloved
Daughter Abigail Simmons five shillings being in full with what she has already received
of all her Portion. Item I give & bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Sarah
Mountant one Negro Girl called Rose & one feather bed & two cows & five ewes
