to be my last Will & Testament in Manner and forme following
I give and Bequeath in manner following First I give to my
Loving Wife Jane Barney all my Land that I am now possessed with
during her Natural life except she deeth first any Tenant or Tenants
upon the said Land I give to my Lawfull wife Jane Barney the best
Bed and furniture during her life. I give to my lawfull wife Jane
Barney Ten pounds Cash. I give three pounds to my Sister

Sarah Barney or her Money. I leave my Negroes to be hired out
Yearly and their Money to be equally Divided between my dearful Wife
Jane Barney and my sister Sarah Barney during their Lives.
I give my Negro Wench Bink to my dearful wife Jane during
her life. I give to William Barney son of William Barney all
my Lands that I am now possessed with after the Death of
my dearful wife Jane Barney and if she should die before he
comes to age the said Land to be rented out yearly and the
Money to be kept for him the said William Barney. I leave
all the rest of my Worldly Goods and Estates to be equally divided
between my dearful Wife Jane Barney and Sarah Barney &
William Barney and the rest of my Brothers & Children Innominate
and appoint my Loving Wife and Richard Barney to be my
Executors of this my last Will and Testament. As Witness
whereof I have set my Hand and Seal this 2^d Day of February 1765.
